

# Three Words... "Day By Day" Pastor Dana Ward

Isn't it interesting how we measure time? Sometimes, as the song says, it's "Day By Day." Other times, we use a stopwatch that can measure ¼ of a second. Greeting a new year on January 1 almost seems "artificial" in some ways. Only a moment passes from one year to the next, yet we see it as a brand new start.

Many of us are eager to welcome the new year. Looking back on 2016, I know I want to move on from my mistakes and disappointments. I want to focus more on building strong relationships and managing my physical and spiritual health.

And there are many reasons to be optimistic about 2017. This is a year with 53 Sundays, one more than usual. This is a year when the church will be focused on the Gospels of Matthew and John in our times of worship.

It is also a year when a total solar eclipse with a very rare path which will cross America's Pacific coast and Atlantic coast will occur.

And, for us movie lovers, the new year promises sequels to *Despicable Me, Cars, Star Wars*, and *Pirates of the Caribbean*. There may also be some original films released (!).

#### Financial Report for November, 2016

November was a tougher month. Three (3) of the four (4) Sundays brought us lower than anticipated receipts and as a result we spent \$1,987.25 more than we collected from the offering plates. The good news is that aside from the normal Sunday receipts, we did receive a sizable and welcome gift from one of our members that kept us in the black for November.

If you're curious about the expenditures: utilities started their winter increase (probably just like you experience at home), several maintenance issues needed attention, a workers' compensation payment came due and we spent more on postage than normal.

Now let's talk about our personal giving during the new year.

Certainly, I encourage you to be thoughtful in your giving to the church during 2017. And, as I've done in the past, would encourage you to consider—or better yet—start tithing. I swear—it works!

In the latest edition of *Guideposts*, Contributing Editor, John Sherrill, writes about giving and tithing far better than I can. So, I'm quoting from his recent piece. He writes about the decision he and his wife made years ago to start tithing. While they began the giving they were "wondering what—if anything—the 'receive' promise might turn out to be." He said, "I did notice one small thing: an all but imperceptible shift in what I thought about while shaving, say, or while waiting at a traffic light. I noticed it was it was less and less often about money."

"In place of preoccupation with the state of our fragile finances, I sensed an awareness of being *cared for*. A sense of security that had nothing to do with money in the bank," he writes. He goes on to say that, "What giving provides is awareness. Awareness of the constant, lavish giving of God to us all."

That sounds pretty good to me. In fact, you've heard me testify before that tithing has worked for me. I don't know how it works. It just does. You might like to give it a try.
