- Expand understanding of and participation in God's mission.
- · Increase sensitivity to all human beings—their needs, interests and concerns.
- Encourage critical thinking about issues facing humanity today.
- Grow in understanding of Scripture as it relates to Christian faith in contemporary life.
- Enhance self-knowledge and act from that knowledge.
- Strengthen involvement in local and global Christian mission



As we enter Lent this month, I hope we will see the "Signs Of Life" that are around us. Springtime will soon arrive. And in the church, growth in our ongoing groups, and some new, special events will keep things refreshing.

As you may know, during Lent this year we are using Adam Hamilton's book, *The Gospel of Light and Life*, to look at St. John's view of how Jesus is the Light of the World. Finance Report for January, 2017

As I've written before, Trinity Church finished 2016 in the black with enough cushion to give us a good start with the new year. Last year we had to "borrow" money from the trustees' revolving loan fund that I've maintained for many years. We used that money to shore up our payroll account because the weekly offering was insufficient to cover the monthly payroll. In January I was able to pay that money back, in full, to the fund.

We also had enough money in January to be able to make a decent payment toward this year's Conference Apportionments. The total of this year's obligation is \$32,243 and already we've paid 22% of them. Good for us! That gave us a good start and if we can nibble away at the balance each month, we should (I hope) be able to pay 100% of that budget line item by the end of the year.


For many years now we have wisely salted money away to help us meet the inevitable unexpected projects that come along. Some people don't like that, but it has saved us from having to have periodic fundraisers, or seek commercial financing to fix the need or problem. And that has bode well for us.

Very soon you will see much more hot water in the bathrooms and small kitchen as a result of a new hot water heater. The really big project, however, will be a new roof over the entire building. It's about to leak in spots and we don't want leaks to damage the interior of the building. Have you priced a new roof for your own home lately and were shocked? If so, then think about the cost of a new roof for the church. The bottom line for us is that we will have enough money to pay for it as a result of our investing and saving. No fundraiser!

In a later newsletter, I'll talk about our investments in greater detail and the need to enhance them even further for the future security of the church.

In the meantime, please know that your financial commitment to Trinity Church really matters!
