Three Words... "Use The Force" Pastor Dana Ward

A long time ago... well, forty years ago actually... the phrase "Use The Force" was first spoken in a galaxy far, far away and has been heard around the world ever since. In May of 1977, the first of the *Star Wars* films was released and introduced us to the Empire, Rebellion, and the Jedi Knights who served as guardians of peace and justice.

In these films, the Jedi study and utilize the Force - an energy field created by all living things. According to character Ben Kenobi, "It surrounds us and penetrates us; binding the galaxy together." In other scenes, we learn that the Force has a light side and a dark side, and that only when those sides are in balance will the galaxy know peace.

In the climactic scene of *Star Wars*, the hero Luke must fire a small proton torpedo into an extremely small, unprotected vent to destroy the Empire's most powerful weapon. At Ben Kenobi's urging, to "Use The Force," Luke turns off his navigational and targeting devices. Only then is he able to focus on targeting the vent manually, his eyes and hands guided by the Force. Of course, he hits his target and saves the day.

"This is the best demonstration of how to practice faith that I have ever seen," says author Caleb Grimes. He says, "No matter how much technology we have, or how much we learn, we come to moments when we understand that what must be done we can't accomplish on our own. So, we ask for help from a higher power whom we believe is there to somehow come to our aid in these moments. Then, finally we win, reach a goal, or do the impossible."

I'm not sure how closely the Force equates with all of our Christian beliefs and the work of the Holy Spirit, but I think any encouragement for us to work for light and peace is a good thing. So, as we celebrate this *Star Wars* anniversary, and unselfishly live out our faith this month, let's not be afraid to "Use The Force."

Financial Report for March, 2017

The end of March is also the closing of 25% of our fiscal year—already! Watch your mailbox. The Christmas catalogues will be arriving soon.

With a quarter of the year expired you would expect that we should have expended around 25% of our budget by now. And that's about what's happened in most of the budgeted line items. A few items are over expended, but in each case it's not a problem.

For instance, we have already paid 32% of our conference apportionments. That's a good thing. We've also paid 50% of the insurance on our buildings and property and that's simply because of when the payments are due. 48% of our postage budget is already spent, but here we establish an account with the post office early in the year and we should only see small draws from that account during the remainder of the year.

On the other hand, some line items remain under 25%. We have only spent 19% of our building maintenance budget, 17% of the worship and 9% of the education appropriations.

The bottom line is that our expenditures, over all, are right on target.

We are entering the time of year, however, when I get quite concerned about the monthly revenue—the weekly offerings. They usually slow during the warmer months while people vacation. But the expenditures of the church don't stop or even slow up during the summer season. Staff still gets paid, maintenance continues, utilities keep running, etc. During March we spent \$2,774 more than we received and we need to turn that around.

As the year continues, please consider that the viability of Trinity Church depends on ALL of us.
