The phrase "When In Rome" is actually a shortened form of the saying 'When in Rome, do as the Romans do.' This refers to the importance of following the customs of the people we are with, in certain places or situations. It's often used as a reminder to behave like they do so as not to offend or transgress local laws or practices.

This year, our VBS will be set in Rome and is called "Rome – Paul and the Underground Church." Children from our church and community will learn about God's love and about how God leads us and changes us for the better.

They will see that if they were in Rome in the days of the first century (in New Testament times), things they would have been expected to do were obey the Roman guards, have a stone idol in their home, and go to the marketplace to shop for food each day. Of course, the early Christians did not do all of these things. They worshipped God and shared their faith in Jesus.

The apostle Paul, who was a Roman citizen, was a leader and an important example for the church. Paul spent a couple of years in Rome, and encouraged many people there to learn and grow in the faith.

This is a good reminder to us as well that we should be careful not to blindly follow others and just do what everyone else is doing. Whether we are in Rome, or Bowling Green, we should bravely live out our faith.

I know you will join me in praying for this year's VBS and for the teachers, students, and volunteers that will be a part of it, so that "When In Rome" with us, their hearts will be filled, and their time will be blessed.

Finance Report for May, 2017

The month of May brought us both good and bad news. The good news first.

With a few minor details to yet be finished by Ron, the roof project has been completed. The contractor is finished and we are waiting on an inspection of work by the materials manufacturer. When that inspection is finished, I will pay the final bill. The total cost of that roof project was slightly over \$100,000.

The real good news here is that we were able to pay for that work in its entirety from the interest money we have earned from the investment of the Euler/White endowment fund. That's certainly better than a fundraiser and most certainly better than going into debt. And we've protected the interior of the building from potential water damage. Thank the Trustees for their foresight.

Another piece of good news is that we now have a new handicapped accessible restroom—finished and paid for—I think. Bills for that work have come in sporadically, but it appears that the total cost was just pennies under \$20,000.

Now the other side of the coin.

We took a beating in the general operating fund during May. We spent \$2,443.53 more than we received, leaving a balance in the account of a whopping \$236.97. I'd guess that most of us probably have more than that in our personal checking accounts. And May was the first month this year when I was not able to send any money to the Conference toward our annual apportionments. Other than not paying apportionments, expenses for the month were rather normal. But revenue was way down.

This general operating fund is where the money comes from to keep the lights on and pay our people. So—please, as the summer heats up and attendance slips as you vacation, remember that your church continues to need your financial commitment and your prayers.

Annual Conference 2017

The Logo for this year's conference is very meaningful. Some of us are, indeed, fearful. Many things shock us into alertness: the world-wide situation with immigration; talk of possible division of the church; the loss of key members in our own church; and the handling of government affairs, just to name a few.

Yet we, who profess to be Christians, know that God is in charge. The first chapter of Joshua, verse 9 says "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." This year's conference was based upon dealing with fear.

Missional Church Consultation Initiative [MCCI]

First launched in 2011, the West Ohio Missional Church Consultation Initiative (MCCI) resources



churches and their pastors with an intensive consultation and clergy coaching model designed to intervene in local churches that are currently plateaued, are in decline, or are on the way "up" but not sure what should come next -- and have the pastoral leadership and potential resources to jumpstart a new life cycle of ministry fruitfulness.

MCCI is comprised of a group of churches each year that have been recommended by the cabinet as meeting specific criteria, and then are prayerfully selected and invited by the Bishop to participate. For congregations that sign up, there is a written agreement to subscribe to a "Prescription" of activities and procedure

Update on Recommendation #6 from 2016. [MCCI]

A lot of money was being spent on MCCI so in 2016 the Conference asked for figures that's would show the effectiveness of the program. Some figures were presented but proved to be less than supportive. Further, the data was not enough to offer much insight. In fairness, the program was not actually started until 2013 and a five to seven year time frame is needed to measure effective results. In the end, the report was referred back for more understandable reporting in 2018.

Light The Way Initiative



We are anxious to build new churches and new opportunity to win souls for Christ. This involves an expenditure of money and discernment. "I believe our next faithful step is to focus on taking a bold leap here in West Ohio in starting new churches and strategically revitalizing others so that 'more people, more young people, more diverse people' meet the Risen Christ who yearns to be in relationship with each of us." – Bishop Gregory Palmer For this to succeed we must invest in existing congregations with a special vision, and in new faith communities that have high potential to offer the light of Christ to our world. We will need to recruit special leaders who have talent, carefully assess their skills, train new leaders, coach, and fund the leadership.

The "Light the Way" budget includes

- Opening at least 12 new churches [\$3.6 million]
- 310 churches strengthened [\$1.4 million]
- Total budget over 5 years [\$5 million]

At the conference, the "Light the Way" offering totaled over \$300,000. Money already given and promised could bring this to over \$380,000. Other promises bring our potential funding to \$1,200,000 in the first year. It is expected that the \$5 million goal will be met.

A new Safe Sanctuar-

ies policy was presented at this year's Annual Conference session as well. Safe Sanctuaries is the name commonly given by the Conference and local churches to their individual efforts to make conference, district, and local church programs welcoming and safe for children, youth, and vulnerable adults.
