

In his book, *The Barbarian Way*, Christian author Edwin Ralph Mcmanus takes a revealing look at the names given to different groups of animals. There is a "school of fish" or "herd of cattle." But he writes that his favorite is a "Crash Of Rhinos."

Yes, a group of 3 or more rhinos, whether standing still or charging at full speed (which is 30 mph by the way), is called a "crash."

Edwin invites us in the church to become like a "crash." He suggests that we should charge ahead in faith wherever the Holy Spirit is leading us. He reminds us that rhinos have thick skin and broad chests that allow them to charge through almost anything.

So, as we move into the Fall, let's "crash" ahead here at Trinity in strength and courage.

Let's charge ahead by praying for more opportunities to share the Gospel and meet the needs of God's people. Let's charge ahead by inviting F.R.A.N. (our Friends, Relatives, Associates, and Neighbors) to worship and special events. Let's charge ahead by expanding the missions we do to feed the hungry.

This can be hard. For example, if we invite someone to church, they may say no. But, let's invite them now, and if they decline, invite them again in a month. Recent studies note that, due to changing circumstances in a person's life, it may take 3 or more invitations to church, even by the same person, for some to accept.

However, the Holy Spirit, that has empowered the church for 2,000 years, leads us as well. So, as you and I share in all of these upcoming ministries at church may it be so we can be like a "Crash Of Rhinos" heading into our future with faith!

#### Financial Report for June, 2017

I don't have too much news to share with you this month. June was rather quiet. We did end the month in the black, thankfully, with a balance in the current operating fund of \$852.03—not the greatest for a church of our size, but at least a positive balance. For the first time in several months, we actually spent less than we received by \$618.06. However, we were not able to send anything to the Conference toward our Apportionments.

We did transfer \$3,000 from the Fair Fund into Scholarships and granted a \$1,500 scholarship to each of two (2) of our young members who will be attending college this fall semester.

As you are certainly aware, for many, many years members of our church and our friends have tended the admission gates at the annual Wood County Fair. And we get paid for doing that. That money goes into what has become known as our "Fair Fund". From that fund we support college scholarships for our members, camping experiences for our youth, and fund other projects and causes deemed appropriate from time to time by the Administrative Council. Some years we've used it to polish off our Apportionments shortfall at the end of a year and in leaner times I've even borrowed against it to meet payroll.

All that said, the Fair Fund is an important backstop.

And here we are at Fair season again. It's so important that <u>all of us</u> answer the call to support Trinity's effort to tend those gates. When we can't fill the time slots, we have to offer them to the church in Portage, and that cuts into our income. <u>You</u> are an important part of helping us to maintain a healthy Fair Fund.

As a veteran gate tender, I can attest that the job can be somewhat hectic at times, but also a lot of fun. You meet some very nice and interesting people. If you haven't already signed up, please do it NOW!

#### **Episcopal Address**



The Bishop's address Monday evening stressed overcoming fear, human sexuality, global partnerships [welcoming

others], global health, gun control, and hope. He stressed living as a world community, making our churches welcoming places for all and welcoming the oppressed into our country.

The disagreement within our church on human sexuality may not be easily settled. First, we must examine the issues, seeking the essentials of the problem. There are ideas with which we may compromise, so we must seek them out and work from them.

The key is to not stop loving one another, and do not stop discussing. Then, the list of "deal-breakers" will be smaller. To continue to argue rather than discuss openly leads to meanness; and we must keep hearts of peace.

The Bishop also said we should treat gun violence as a public health crisis. We are charged to live like health is key to life. In that respect, wellness must be fostered in all people, especially the clergy who give so much for us. Seeing us healthy and happy becomes a light to others with whom we share our faith.

He closed by saying remember to glorify God in Jesus Christ — make disciples — and in all ways, trust Him.

**The Laity Session** on Sunday evening appointed a Conference Lay Leader/advocate, Tracy Chambers. It was noted that we, the members of the church, are not "just" lay persons but have special calls, just as do our clergy / ministers.

**Finances.** Conference finances were strong in 2016, however some churches did not give as expected. Apportionments were returned at a rate of 75%. A normal return is 80%, and

Trinity has, for many years, given our full share of 100%. We are among 574 (57%) of the churches that share fully, some at over 100%. Seventy-five percent giving will not sustain programs on a long-term basis. At this time, health care finances (the conference is self-insured) are doing well.

**Recommendations.** The first of these are standard conference requirements and were changed very little from previous years. All were passed with minimal debate.

#1 Council on Finances & Administration

#2 Commission on Equitable Compensation

#3 Board of Pension & Health Benefits

#4—"We Are All God's Children." We passed a recommendation that calls upon us to ally our fears of other peoples, and instead, welcome them into our communities. This is particularly important if they are from a nation in which they might be in danger, even if they enter the country under less than normal circumstances. So, the West Ohio Conference will, as a body, call on government leaders not to place restrictions on immigration based solely on a religious test within our borders.

**Teaching Moments:** Finally, Rev. Dr. Elaine Heath gave talks on her book "God Unbound: Wisdom from Galatians for the Anxious Church" which said that the church has a vivid future.
