


We Can Be Heroes This Lent.

Finance Report for December, 2017

I'm pleased to tell you that Trinity Church ended 2017 in the black. In fact, we were able to carry over about \$2,900 into the new year. And we always need that carryover due to the heavy bills we must pay every January.

Our ability to end the year in a positive position is thanks to the generosity of many of you who blessed the church with a more-than-usual contribution. It really helped! A special thank you is also due to the Missions Committee. That committee made a substantial contribution to the money we owed to the West Ohio Conference for our conference apportionments. The money received from our Missions Committee went toward the "mission" line items in those apportionments, thus honoring the tenants of our Missions Committee. It's always such a chore to pay our Apportionments in full and certainly a relief when we do. <u>Bottom line: we are a "100% church" for 2017.</u>

So here we go into the new year. I suppose it wouldn't surprise you if I told you that several line items in the budget have increased. Conference Apportionments and District Apportionments have both increased slightly. The Pastor's health insurance increased 9%, property insurance premiums on the church building and the parsonage went up, and postage increased as will the rental agreement on the copier. I'm only guessing on the cost of utilities and hoping that the cold weather will diminish quickly. That's some of the reasons the Pastor asked you last month to consider a "Step Up" in your financial commitment to the church.

If you can "step up," please do. We certainly need it and you can be assured that anyone who spends any of the church's money is doing so as conservatively as possible.

And thank you, yes thank you, for all that you do.

A note from Melissa Hart...

As many of you know, I have been in the process of becoming a pastor for a while now and I am beginning seminary in February. I became a certified candidate last September, which made me eligible for an appointment this year. If you are not familiar with the system, an itinerant United Methodist pastor is appointed to a church, or churches, by their Bishop and District Superintendent who prayerfully match him or her with a congregation. Appointments are reviewed each year.

I have the honor of receiving an appointment this year to serve two churches, St. Paul's UMC in Rising Sun, Ohio, and Kansas UMC in Kansas, Ohio. Both communities are just southeast of Bowling Green. I will begin serving as their pastor on Ash Wednesday, February 14, so my last Sunday at Trinity will be February 11.

The two churches combined are considered a half time appointment, so I have talked to the Staff Parish committee at Trinity about continuing some of my current tasks. The committee and Pastor Dana are prayerfully reviewing my current list of tasks to see if I can be of service. For now, I am working with them to create as smooth of a transition as possible for the church. Then, if God so leads, I will continue some tasks to help Trinity further.

The past six years at Trinity have been a blessing for me and my family. When I first came, I thought I would just serve for a few years while I earned my Master's degree and then become a school principal. It was through my work at Trinity that God reminded me of his real call on my life. I have had a challenging time of growth and discernment while having a great time of serving alongside some really amazing people. John, Luke and I are grateful for the relationships we have made and the support and love you have shown us. We know that will continue as we move forward into the next stage of ministry.

So, more than anything, I would like to say, "Thank you!" Thank you for accepting me and my family so fully at Trinity. Thank you for supporting my crazy ideas and helping make them happen. Thank you for letting me be a part of your praises and problems. Thank you for your trust in sharing this faith journey so we could learn and grow together. And now, thank you for your prayers and care as God adds this new mission field to our lives. As always, may God bless you abundantly.
