Finance Report for May, 2018

Halleluiah!!

We were still in the black at the close of May. The church received \$20,312.24 during the month and had disbursements of \$20,333.23. As you can see we only overspent by \$20.99. When's the last time that happened?

If you remember we had a carryover balance from April and we continue to enjoy a carryover into June of \$2,694.63. While that's a positive position, for a church of our size it's really not much. We just never know when something unexpected will happen. For instance, earlier this month our community experienced a very heavy rainfall. It came down so hard and fast it penetrated the flashing above the windows in the office and streamed down the walls. I haven't seen the bills for that repair and clean-up yet. But it will come.

The disbursements in May also included a significant payment toward our conference apportionments. To date this year we have paid \$10,000 toward those apportionments or 31% of the \$32,547 the West Ohio Conference asks of Trinity Church for 2018.

For some years I have been able to use money in our Fair Fund to shore up accounts and pay some unexpected bills. The Fair Fund also supports the scholarships for our college students and pays half of the expenses of our young people who attend summer camps. It also supplies many of our kitchen expenses as needed. Obviously, the Fair Fund receives its money from the Wood County Fair Board for the work that we do in staffing the gates during the County Fair. It's extremely important that we fill as many of the time slots as we can during Fair week. What we can't fill we turn over to the church in Portage. And that cuts into our total proceeds.

Personally, I enjoy selling the tickets at the Fair. It's an interesting collection of people who step up to buy tickets. Some I know and haven't seen in a long time and others I've never seen before. Most are very friendly and the children are really excited for the rides and the food. The Veterans are rightly proud to display their service IDs or caps and the senior citizens are eager to let you know they've reached that status.

If you've never worked the gates—try it. Grab one of your church friends, neighbors or other friends and do it. Sign up right now before it escapes your mind. My bet is you'll be glad you did. And you'll know that you've helped our church.



Annual Conference 2018

First Report

The 49th Session of the West Ohio Annual Conference began with prayers, worship, and an underlying concern for our future. That concern lies with the positioning on human sexuality by the church. The General Conference will meet in February next year to try to form specific legislation on the matter. Many seem to be losing patience and so we are charged to "Be Not Afraid—There is enough." Enough wisdom, enough patience, enough understanding, and most of all enough faith to see through what could be a major division in Methodism in the United States.

In conjunction with this concern several meaningful presentations were made by individuals highlighting their experiences with racism, gun violence, and disaster response. These segments provoked thought and fresh perspective on the subjects.



Rev. Zan Holmes, Jr. was a guest

speaker with an adjunct professorship at Perkins School of Theology, experience as a former member of the Texas House of Representatives, and many other significant credits, he provided several stimulating presentations with deep and significant meaning.

Dr. Holmes—Opening Worship

Dr. Holmes reminded us that we constantly reap the fruits of the labors of others, but this is as it

should be. We are charged to plant our own seeds for the future. He favored going out to the people because, we should "meet people where they are [and] treat them as if they are where they should be." He reminded us that the church is where there is need, not necessarily in a specific place. We are to give God our hearts-it's the best we can do for Him. Dr. Holmes admonished us to keep a "loose screw" as it will allow God to more easily make modifications to us. We are to stay out of positions where we cannot grow, as God would not have us in those places. Last but not least, he charged us "Don't die before you are dead" as we can be useful to Him regardless of age.

Financial Report

Each segment of the Conference staff was asked to reduce its budget

this year. The net result was a 10% reduction in the overall budget. This represents \$2.25 million less than in 2018. Local churches, on average, paid only 70+% of their recommended apportionments (Trinity paid 100%). Despite this the Conference paid 100% of their apportionment to the General Conference. In summary the Conference is operating more efficiently that ever, but could do better with more of our support.



Episcopal Address

Bishop Palmer provided inspir ing words of confidence concerning finding our way forward on the denomination's homosexuality issues. He is confident that we can overcome the differences and expand to the frontier beyond. He asked us to move forward to examine our motives. "Do we just need someone to hate . . ." "Are we uncomfortable with "nonsimilars" occupying our space?" We must seek strength in dissimilarities because, after all, we are one people and belong to each other. History has shown us that every 500 years or so religion has a major shake-up. It has been almost 500 years and if there is to be a new way, we should throw out the old, and examine the new. The Lord's Goodness will prevail-there is enough!

"Light the Way"

"Light the Way" is a plan to de-



velop new faith communities and increase the number of vital congregations. These congregations are composed of persons actively seeking to find Jesus and to learn his ways. They do not necessarily take place in a church building, but can be just as effective in a bar, a bowling alley, a tattoo parlor, or other place where people gather and are willing to talk seriously about faith. To support this movement most money comes from special gifts [not apportionments] and a goal of \$5 million over a 5-year period has been set. Of this amount over \$2.2 million has been pledged. The offering taken at this conference was over \$100,000 toward the goal.
