Finance Report for June, 2018

Third time's the charm—I hope!

June was the third month in a row that we ended in the black. Not by a whole lot, but still in the black; by \$622.18.

We still had disbursements that exceeded receipts by \$2,072.45. Fortunately, we exited May with a carryover that we chewed up in June but it, at least, allowed us to end the month of June on the positive side. However, there was not enough left to make any payment toward our Conference Apportionments. I'm hoping that July will be better yet.

By the end of the first six (6) months of 2018 we were very close to what we projected to spend. In other words, most of the line items in the budget still had 50% or better remaining in them for the second half of the year. While that sounds good, the problem with the budget is that most of the line items are things that cannot be reduced or modified, and the weekly Sunday collections are not keeping up with our needs.

I will also need to make some adjustments in the budget that always occur when a new pastor is assigned to Trinity Church. I'm yet to do that because, believe it or not, I still have not received the figures I need from the West Ohio Conference. All in all, I doubt that the bottom line will be much different than we started with in January.

Here's hoping—and praying—that the third month in the black will lead into the forth month of positive figures and on and on.



There are many ways to connect to Christ and we at Trinity Church are committed to helping you find the place of service that fits your passion and your giftedness. Our goal is not to just fill slots; our goal is to have every person be able to say, "I know I'm right where God wants me to be!" Please know we are here to assist you as you seek God's will in the area of service. Please ask yourself where you will be able to find how your gifts and the church's needs connect. Below are just some of the areas of service offered here at Trinity UM Church.

Homebound Visitation Ministry

Some of our members are unable to make it to church, so the church goes to meet them in their home or those who reside in managed care. Visits include bringing bulletins and reading material to the homebound, along with providing fellowship.

Sunday Morning Greeters

Welcome all members and visitors as they come in. Greeters need to be able to answer questions, direct people to different services, areas and classes.

Usher

Volunteers are asked to help for a month of Sundays. Responsibilities include handing out bulletins, collecting the offering and distributing communion.

Liturgist Read Scripture during service.

Communion Steward Cut bread, set up communion stations with chalices/cups, bread containers, and napkins.

Chancel Choir (Adult) Singers always welcome: High School and older. Rehearsal Thursdays at 7:00.

Children of God Choir (Children) Singers always welcome. Rehearsal schedule TBA.

Handbell Choir (Adult) Adult hand bell choir. Rehearsal on Thursdays at 6:00.

Early Elementary Sunday School Teacher (Ages 4-8) and Older Elementary Sunday School Teacher (Ages 9-12) and Youth Sunday School Teacher (Middle and High School Ages) Guide children with curriculum provided as they grow in their love and understanding of themselves, of God, of God's love through Jesus Christ and of how we can share the love of Jesus with others. Will have a rotation schedule for the teachers so will not be needed every Sunday. Must be Safe Sanctuary certified.

Children's Church Helper

Using provided, age-appropriate curriculum, help lead lessons during worship. For ages 4 years through 12. Must be Safe Sanctuary certified.

Dr. Holmes—Tuesday Worship

"Way Forward"—Proposals

In an effort to deal with the Homosexuality debate, the bishops were asked to help with a solution. They have three recommendations:

- 1. <u>The Traditionalist Plan</u>, which would affirm the current language in the denomination's Book of Discipline, the denomination's governing document, and seek to strengthen enforcement.
- 2. <u>The Connectional-</u> <u>Conference Plan</u>, which would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry—be it traditionalist, progressive, or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination's constitution.
- 3. <u>The One Church Plan</u>, with which decisions

about whether to ordain LGBTQ clergy or to officiate at same-gender unions would be made closer to the congregational level. The plan would remove the restrictive language against the practice of homosexuality in the Book of Discipline. The plan also adds assurances to pastors and conferences who in good conscience cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy that they don't have to do so.

The One Church plan seems to be favored at this time because it encourages a generous unity by giving members the ability to address different Missional contexts in ways that reflect their convictions. All three plans will be submitted to the General Conference on 23-26 February 2019.

Business of the Conference



- 1. Passed the 2019 Budget with 10% reduction over last year.
- 2. **Passed** a Conference Board of Pension & Health benefits which is largely unchanged
- 3. **Passed** an increase of 2% for minimum salaries of pastors, deacons, and elders.
- 4. **Approved**, after much debate, a vacation policy for pastors, deacons, and elders.
- 5. **Approved** removing investment restrictions placed by the 2011 Conference. Investments are now better defined making restrictions unnecessary.
- 6. **Passed** the recommendation calling for clergy and congregations of West Ohio to sup-

port United Methodists and churches within the conference that provide material, legal and spiritual services to refugees and immigrants and to support congregations who, abiding by legal decisions of the court, provide temporary sanctuary to individuals or families

Bishop Palmer to Host Gatherings

Bishop Palmer will hold several gatherings throughout the conference this



autumn. Entitled "I Believe in the church: A Time of Inspirational Worship, Teaching and testifying." The sessions are open to all West Ohio United Methodists. Everyone is encouraged to attend. Bishop Palmer states, he "believes in the church, not because it is perfect, but because it is of God. Tell the pallbearers to stand down. God is not done with the church."
