#### Sunday School Classes to Begin September 9th from 9:15-10:15 a.m. The Young and the Rest of Us

In this class we have robust discussions surrounding Scripture and topics relevant for today's Christian that strengthen our faith and awaken our spirit. We are currently studying "Follow", a video sermon series by Andy Stanley that is showing us what it means to be a follower of Jesus. On September 23<sup>rd</sup> we will begin reading and discussing the popular books "The Circle Maker" and "Draw the Circle" which will show us how we can transform our prayer life and experience prayer like we never have before. Join us in the library next to the main office for this exciting time of learning and growing!

#### Loyal Hearts

The Loyal Hears Class meets in the Sunday School Room on the east side of the church building, third level, north of the sanctuary. The class will be studying the current Cokesbury Methodist material which in the past has included both Old and New Testament scripture. The class prays together, discusses scripture and enjoys the gift of laughter. An offering is taken each Sunday that is used to support both local and global mission. The class is facilitated by Sue Butler and members who are willing to substitute. Come join us and see what you think!

#### Royal Builders

The Royal Builders Class is the oldest class at Trinity, dating to the mid 1940's. It is located on the Summit St side of the sanctuary overflow room and is also the prayer room. The curriculum is the United Methodist Version of the International Sunday School Lesson which looks at both the historical/biblical context of the scripture and it's meaning for the church in today's world. Much of the time is spent in discussion. It is taught by Helen Dukes, retired teacher and clergywoman, who enjoys the wisdom and insights of the older generation. The class is very small, informal, friendly and welcoming to everyone.

#### The Summit

The Summit (formerly known as The Perfect Blend) is an informal class for adults. Psalm 18:2 states: "My God is my rocky summit where I take shelter, my shield, the horn that saves me, and my refuge." This class has no age limit, spouse requirement, or child requirement. You can wear shorts or a tux and bring your coffee! The goal is to grow in community and in Christ. Class meets in the room at the top of the stairs off the over flow room. 

#### **Chancel Choir**

#### Handbell Choir (Adult)

The Chancel Handbell Choir meets on Thursday evenings at 6:00 on the third floor in the bell room. We rehearse each week for one hour beginning September 6th to the middle of May and ring as a part of the second worship service about once a month. We have a short rehearsal before the service when we ring. Have you ever thought of ringing but had questions? Let me answer the most common ones.

Do I need to be able to read music? NO, all you need to be able to do is to count to 4 and to distinguish your right hand from your left.
 Do I need to be able to stand for the entire hour rehearsal? NO, we have a few stools for ringers who need to sit.

3. Do I need to wear gloves? Yes, to protect your hands from the bell handles and the bells from your hands.

4. Do I need to attend all rehearsals? Yes, if you are not in attendance, your bells will be silent. Imagine trying to sing a hymn on Sunday with missing notes!

5. Do angels play heavenly harps? NO, they ring handbells!

Esther Circle was organized in November of 1965 pioneering the first breakfast meeting of the UMW Circles at Trinity. Although there have been several other Circles, we are presently the only Circle and still have our meetings to include breakfast on the second Wednesday of each month. We meet at the Big Boy Restaurant on East Wooster Street in Bowling Green at 8:45 am. This time of fellowship starts with a short business meeting after breakfast and concludes with a program given by one of our members, or sometimes a guest speaker. We presently have about 23 members but would love to have more. All Trinity women are welcome to attend and become part of this mission-oriented group. Many of our members are involved in other Trinity projects. Within the Circle, we have a Secret Prayer Partner group going, and this past year, we have sent Easter and Christmas cards to our nursing home residents and home shut-ins, supported the Brown Bag Program with a food drive, collected several baskets of personal-care items for Women's care shelters, and support Friendly Center when able. 
#### **Bible Study**

#### Finance Report for July, 2018

A week ago at church someone asked me if we'd be in the black for a fourth month in a row. At that time I wasn't sure but I thought we'd be close. Well, we did it! The fourth month with no red ink. We ended July with a cushion of \$1,482.69.

And that's after paying the insurance on the church building of almost \$2,000. However, again in July there wasn't enough to whittle down the amount we owe to the West Ohio Conference for our apportionments.

One thing that really helped us during July was Workers' Compensation, of all things. We received a check from Workers' Comp for \$1,143. The accompanying letter said that it represented 85% of the premium that we paid to Worker's Comp the preceding year. It seems that the investments that it has been making were doing so well that the Bureau was able to return such substantial amounts. God provides in totally unexpected ways! Had it not been for that reimbursement our month-end balance would have only been \$339.69.

We still have some work to do! It's too soon to report on the earnings from our annual Fair Gate project. I'm told that the Fair admissions may have been down slightly, but the cost of admission was increased so overall it was a good season for the Fair. When you see them, offer special thanks to Dennis Donley and Andrew Janes. They both worked tirelessly all week—and prior to—coordinating all of us who worked at the gates.

I have faith in you and our church overall. I've seen many good things happening just in the last month and I'm confident our future will brighten. Thank you for all that you do.
